



## PALTRACK AND IMPERIAL GREENS WESTERN CAPE SCHOOL

Paltrack, a member of the IMPERIAL Logistics™ Group, planted trees at one of the local Cape Town schools. These tree planting initiatives are taking place in partnership with Food & Trees for Africa, who are assisting with the procurement of trees and providing logistical support at each event.

As producers of oxygen and food, as well as being a mechanism through which carbon dioxide is literally locked away, our environment needs more trees. It has been calculated that one mature leafy tree produces as much oxygen in a season as 10 people inhale in a year. In addition, trees help to clean our air, fight soil erosion and reduce heat levels.

A 15 minute presentation was given to the children outlining what Paltrack does, how we fit into the IMPERIAL Group and our way forward relating to supporting environmental causes.
